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Ofsted potential changes 2019.





Context of Inspection

- 1992 - Ofsted created, 7 point grading system.
- 1994- Teams of up to 15 inspectors, 5 grades.
- 2005- 4 grades.
- 2010- Satisfactory replaced by Requires Improvement.

Schools North East Summit

- The framework will be designed to allow teachers and leaders to focus more of their time on the real substance of education.
- Inspectors need to compliment rather than intensify performance data.

Consultation

- Schools will no longer receive a separate grade for outcomes for pupils.
- Focus will be on the substance of education and a broad curriculum.
- More involvement for classroom teachers, leaders- ‘conversations’.
- Changes September 2019.

NEW

- New judgment for ‘quality of education’ replacing current ‘outcomes for pupils’ and ‘teaching, learning and assessment’.
- Personal development, welfare and behaviour’, separated into 2 judgements.

3 Distinct Aspects

Under the 'quality of education' judgement:

Intent-what does a school want for its children?

Implementation-how is teaching and assessment fulfilling the intent?

Impact-results and wider outcomes achieved and 'destinations that children go on to'.

Overall

- An effectiveness grade will continue to be awarded using the 4 point scale.
- OR WILL IT!
- Leadership and management remains a key judgement.
