Some Statistics - Can Schools Do Everything?

- Being poor often leads to a lifetime of poverty
- 6 out of 10 disadvantaged children do not achieve a basic set of gcse qualifications
- The NE has amongst the lowest levels of progression and highest rates of youth unemployment and NEETS
- Half of lifetime mental illnesses start by age 14
- Suicide is one of the three most common causes of death in youth and is rising significantly
- More than a third of UK children are overweight or obese
- Anti-social behaviour affects more than 5% of children
- Average student debt is £44,035 with 73% of students expected to be unable to pay off this debt
- 80% of teachers feel stressed, anxious or depressed at work

Schools need help to support students.

- Year 4, Lead share a business engagement programme with other schools to become a regional source of expertise and cpd provision.
