Recruitment and retention strategy

The government will

- Develop a jobshare match-up site
- Provide a fully-funded 2-year training package for all early career teachers through the Early Careers Framework
- Develop specialist qualifications for seasoned professionals
- Introduce a new online platform to make it easier to apply for Initial Teacher Training
- Launch an initiative to allow more people to give teaching a try



Recruitment and retention strategy

Edtech Strategy

The government has announced plans to:

- Improve infrastructure and connectivity
- Improve support and training for schools on how best to use Edtech
- Support schools with procuring IT
- Promote digital safety and security



Edtech Strategy

- Is tech increasing or decreasing staff workload at school?
- Is your school “in the cloud” or reliant on servers?
- Are you making tech decisions at GB or are most of these decisions made at MAT, LA level?



School funding

Spending per pupil has fallen 8% in real terms since 2009 -10 levels

Because:

- There are more pupils in the system
- National Insurance and Teachers Pensions

The Education Policy Institute found

- Almost one in three (30.3%) of local authority (LA) maintained secondary schools were in deficit in 2017-18 – almost four times that of 2014 (8.1%). Only 8% of LA primaries
- Average deficit of a secondary is half a million pounds
- 60% of maintained secondary schools spent more than their income in 2017-18



School funding

SEND Funding

- According to the LGA councils are currently facing a SEND funding gap of almost £500 million in 2018/19.
- In December 2018, the Government announced much welcomed [additional funding](#), however this will only partially address the gap, which is expected to reach £800 million by 2019/20, and a potential £1.6 billion by 2020/21.
- Damian Hinds announced last week a call for evidence on SEND funding to run in July.
